### What are the fundamental units of committee?

## What is Parliamentary Procedure?

- Formal debate we use in committee
  - Example: Decorum (order in committee)
- Consists of POINTS and MOTIONS
  - There are different points and motions that only chairs use and only delegates use

#### Why do we have Parliamentary Procedure?

- Promotes order within a committee
- Ensures that debate is flowing properly and in an orderly fashion
- Points are so delegates have a clear understanding of committee
- Motions further ideas made in debate

## Motions—used to promote the flow of debate

- Motion to open debate
- Motion to set the agenda
- Motion to set the speaker's time (most disruptive)
- Motion to start the speaker's list

# Points-used for personal use of delegates

- Point of Information
- Point of Inquiry
- Point of Clarification
- Point of Order/ Point of Parliamentary Procedure
- Point of Personal Privilege

### Tips for Public Speaking

- Remain calm! Everyone is here to support you and is not judgemental
- Try and keep your hands by your side and refrain from fidgeting, swaying, playing with hair, etc.
- Project your voice and enunciate so everyone can hear you!
- Think about what you're going to say before you speak

### Tip for this debate:

- Be aware of when debate is getting redundant
  - Try to take a stand that is more controversial (Devil's advocate)
  - Introduce aspects of the topics that have not been discussed
  - If you agree with a point, don't just restate; rather, add your own elaboration
