What are the different ways of speaking in committee?

- Speaker's List
- Moderated Caucus
- Unmoderated Caucus

What is a moderated caucus?

- Talk to people directly in an open debate setting
 - Delegates get up from their seats and talk with different delegates around the room
- How to motion:
 - Motion for a moderated caucus on the topic of (SUBTOPIC) for (TOTAL TIME OF CAUCAUS) minutes with a (INDIVIDUAL SPEAKING TIME) second/minute speaking time.
- Unmods are used when delegates want to discuss solutions more in depth with specific people, to form **alliances/blocs**, and start resolutions (you will learn about resolutions later on)

Some extra things to know:

- Passing notes is another form of communication delegates use in committee to communicate with each other. However, do not take advantage of this privilege!
- A **bloc** is essentially a combination of nations/parties sharing the same position on a topic/idea
- You can form **alliances** with other delegates in your committee if the nation you are representing agrees with another nation's view
